 - > Q2a Yes
 - > Q2b Yes – and report incidents in the agency’s annual report
 - > Q3a not sure
 - > Q3b yes to make it clear
 - > Q3c It would be helpful – or it could be set out in guidance documents issued by the Privacy Commissioner
 - > Q4 I believe all data/privacy breaches should be reported to IPC and the affected individuals notified, where at all possible.
 - > Q5 Best if set out in legislation
 - > Q6 Follow GDPR standards
 - > Q7a Fines should be a possibility, particularly where an agency did not conduct a Privacy Impact Assessment that could have prevented the incident
